

Cochlear Center Hearing and Aging Mentoring Program

Saturday, June 25, 2022 - Friday, July 1, 2022

Purpose

The Summer **Cochlear Center Hearing and Aging Mentoring Program (CHAMP)** at the Johns Hopkins Cochlear Center for Hearing and Public Health brings together students early in their doctoral training from audiologic, medicine, and public health programs for an intensive multidisciplinary 1-week virtual program. The aim of the program is to provide a foundation of public health concepts and methodology in the context of age-related hearing loss to stimulate and promote future research careers to address hearing loss with aging in public health.

Students will begin the program with a 1-day intensive virtual summer course, Epidemiologic Approaches to Hearing Loss and Public Health, which includes didactic lectures covering epidemiology, biostatistics, clinical trials, gerontology, and intervention concepts in hearing loss. The rest of the program will include additional didactic lectures, and seminars and journal clubs with Cochlear Center faculty. During the entirety of the program, students will work in cross-disciplinary teams under the mentorship of Cochlear Center faculty to produce a final research project. Presentation of summer projects at a national conference is highly encouraged (travel funding may be available).

Funding

Students will receive complimentary tuition for required didactic coursework and there is no cost to participate.

Application Procedures

This program is designed for audiology, public health, allied health, and medical graduate students currently enrolled in an AuD, MD, or public-health related PhD program who are interested in building a foundation in age-related hearing loss and public health research. Candidates must submit the requested documents through the program application link by **March 15, 2022, 11:59pm ET**.
